What is it?

The Cabinetry, Millwork, and Woodworking pathway provides learning opportunities for students interested in preparing for careers in cabinet construction, millwork, finish carpentry, and furniture making for both production and custom products.

Cabinetmakers

Average Salary: \$37,520

Fabricate furniture and other wood-surfaced assemblies using blue-prints and design/engineering drawings. Assemble, pin, and glue cabinet shells; install drawer-slides, hinges, latches, and other hardware. Apply exterior surface materials such as veneer and laminate.



Woodworking Machine Setters, Operators, Tenders

Average Salary: \$56,990

Set up, operate, or tend woodworking machines, such as drill presses, lathes, shapers, routers, sanders, planers, and wood nailing machines. May operate CNC equipment.



Bench Carpenters

Average Salary: \$42,780

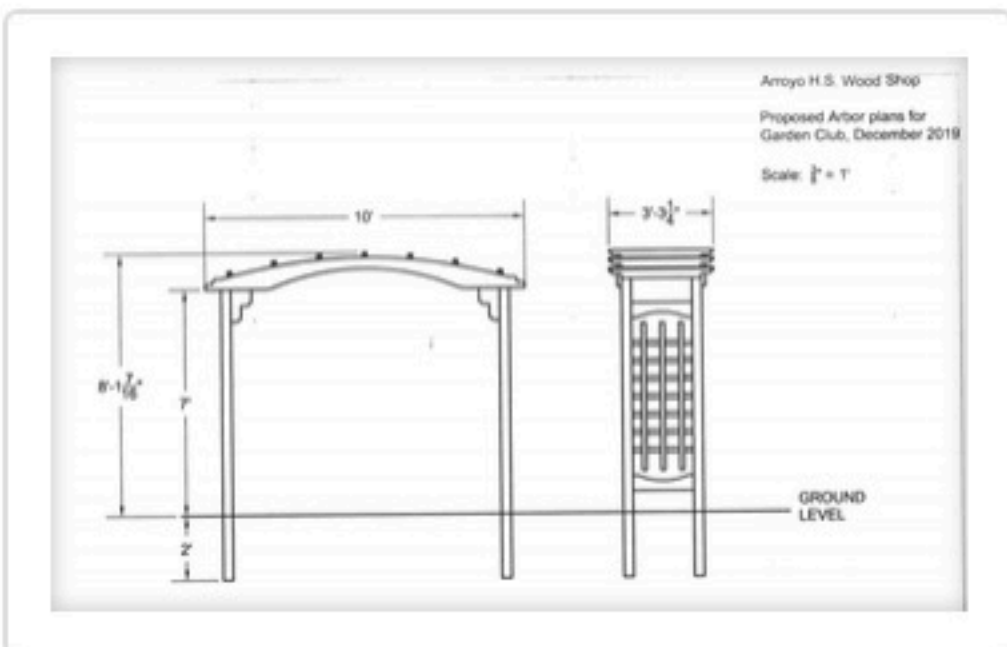
Cut, shape, and assemble wooden articles or set up and operate a variety of woodworking machines, such as power saws, jointers, and mortisers to surface, cut, or shape lumber or to fabricate parts for wood products.
