

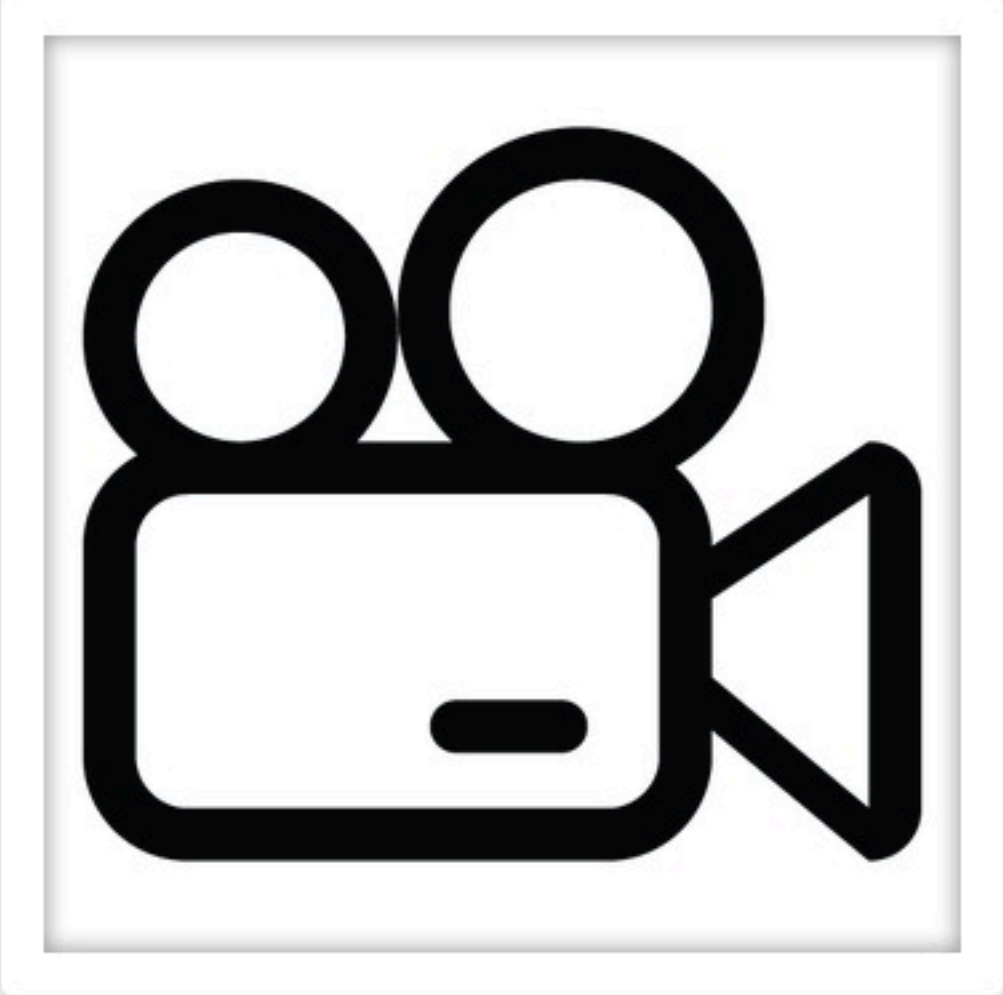
# Film/Video Production

## What is it?

Operate television, video, or motion picture camera to record images or scenes for various purposes, such as TV broadcasts, advertising, video production, or motion pictures. Apply the technical aspects of light, lenses, film, filters, and camera settings to achieve the effects sought by directors. Edit video for broadcast productions.

### Camera Operator

**Average Salary: \$77,540**

Knowledge of media production, communication, and dissemination techniques and methods, including alternative ways to inform and entertain via written, oral, and visual media.



### Audio and Video Equipment Technician

**Average Salary: \$56,710**

Set up and operate audio and video equipment including video screens, projectors, video monitors, recording equipment, connecting wires and cables, sound and mixig boards, and related electronic equipment for concerts, sports events, meetings and conventions, presnetations, and news conferences.



### Film and Video Editor

**Average Salary: \$112,530**

Organize raw footage into a contiuous whole according to scripts or instructions of directors; review assembled films or edited tapes to make necessary corrections; trim film segments and reassemble in sequences that present stories with maximum effect; determine audio and visual effects.
