

Audio and Video Equipment Technician

Average Salary: \$56,710

Set up and operate audio and video equipment includig video screens, projectors, video monitors, recodrding equipment, connecting wires and cables, sound and mixig boards, and related electronic equipment for concerts, sports events, meetings and conventions, presnetations, and news conferences.

Film and Video Editor

Average Salary: \$112,530

Organize raw footage into a continuous whole according to scripts or instructions of directors; review assembled films or edited tapes to make necessary corrections; trim film segments and reassemble in sequences that present stories with maximum effect; determine audio and visual effects.
