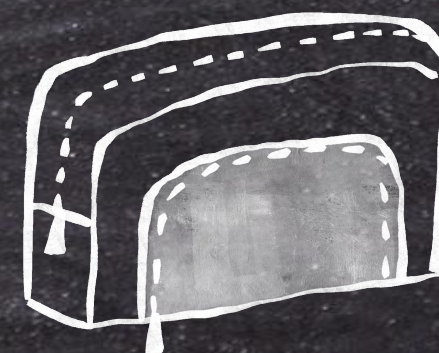
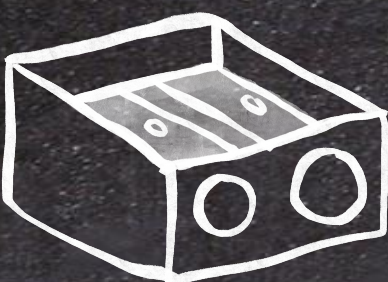

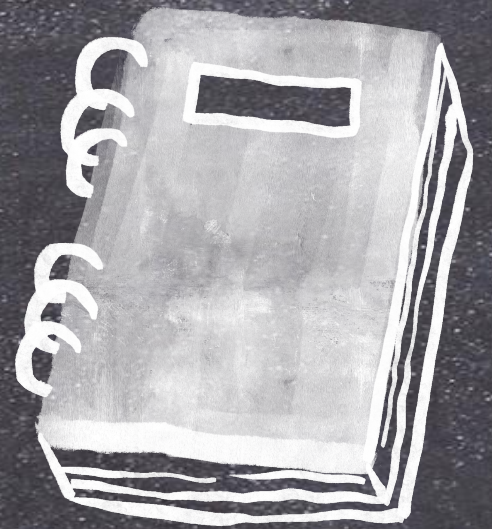

What you need to know prior to selecting your courses

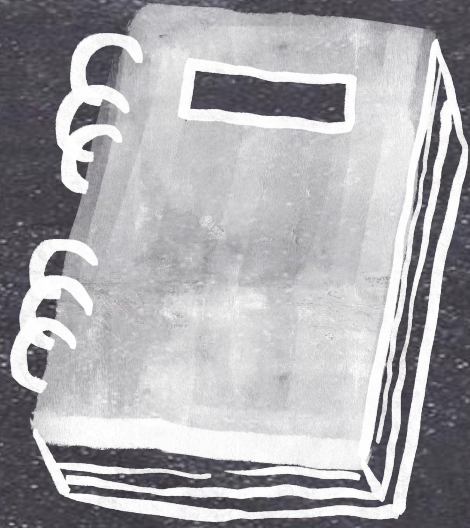
- Please select your classes carefully!
- Do NOT make your selections based on teachers. Teachers may teach different classes from year to year.
- You are making a year-long commitment to enroll in the courses you select. You may NOT drop a class because you change your mind or do not like the grade you earn first semester. Program changes after the beginning of the school year are considered only if compelling circumstances warrant a change and class space is available.





What you need to know prior to selecting your courses

- Students planning to take AP/Honors Courses must review and sign the [AP Agreement](#) with your parent or guardian. This is available through your English teacher or in the Guidance Office.

Parent/Student Agreement

Instructions: Read the agreement, complete the bottom of this form, and submit it to your counselor on your scheduled registration date. Enrollment in an Honors/Pre-AP/AP course will NOT be allowed without the submission of this form.

All students and parents of those students who wish to register for an Accelerated, Honors, or Advanced Placement (AP) course must sign the following agreement. Signatures affirm that:

1. Parent and student agree that the student meets the prerequisites and has the skills and tenacity for the class(es) indicated below.
Participating in Honors/Accelerated/AP classes requires the student to:
 - a. Demonstrate increased independence.
 - b. Take on a high degree of responsibility.
 - c. Meet higher standards than students in non-Honors/AP courses to earn the same grade.
 - d. Spend as much as 1 1/2 - 2 hours of homework each night per class. ***Please take this into consideration when enrolling in multiple AP classes.**
 - e. Commit to remain enrolled in the class(es) for the entire school year. All classes are year-long commitments.
 - f. Take the AP Exam for the corresponding course in May. A student who fails to take the corresponding AP exam will lose AP credit and the class title will change to Non-AP. Currently, all AP exams are paid for by EMUHSU.
 - g. Uphold the school's academic integrity policy. A student may be dropped from the class(es) if cheating, plagiarism, or work not personally completed by the student is submitted. *Other consequences may occur depending on circumstance.
2. While transfers to a non-Honors/AP class may be granted, the following policy will apply:
 - a. Parents/students may request a transfer within the first three weeks of the fall semester.
 - b. Teachers may request a student be transferred within the first three weeks of the fall semester if the student does not display behavior consistent with the behaviors outlined in 1.a - 1.g above.
 - c. All transfer requests will result in a parent conference. **Permission to transfer will be granted only if space is available in other non-AP courses.**
 - d. Grades earned in the Honors/AP class(es) will be transferred to the non-Honors/AP class(es), when appropriate.

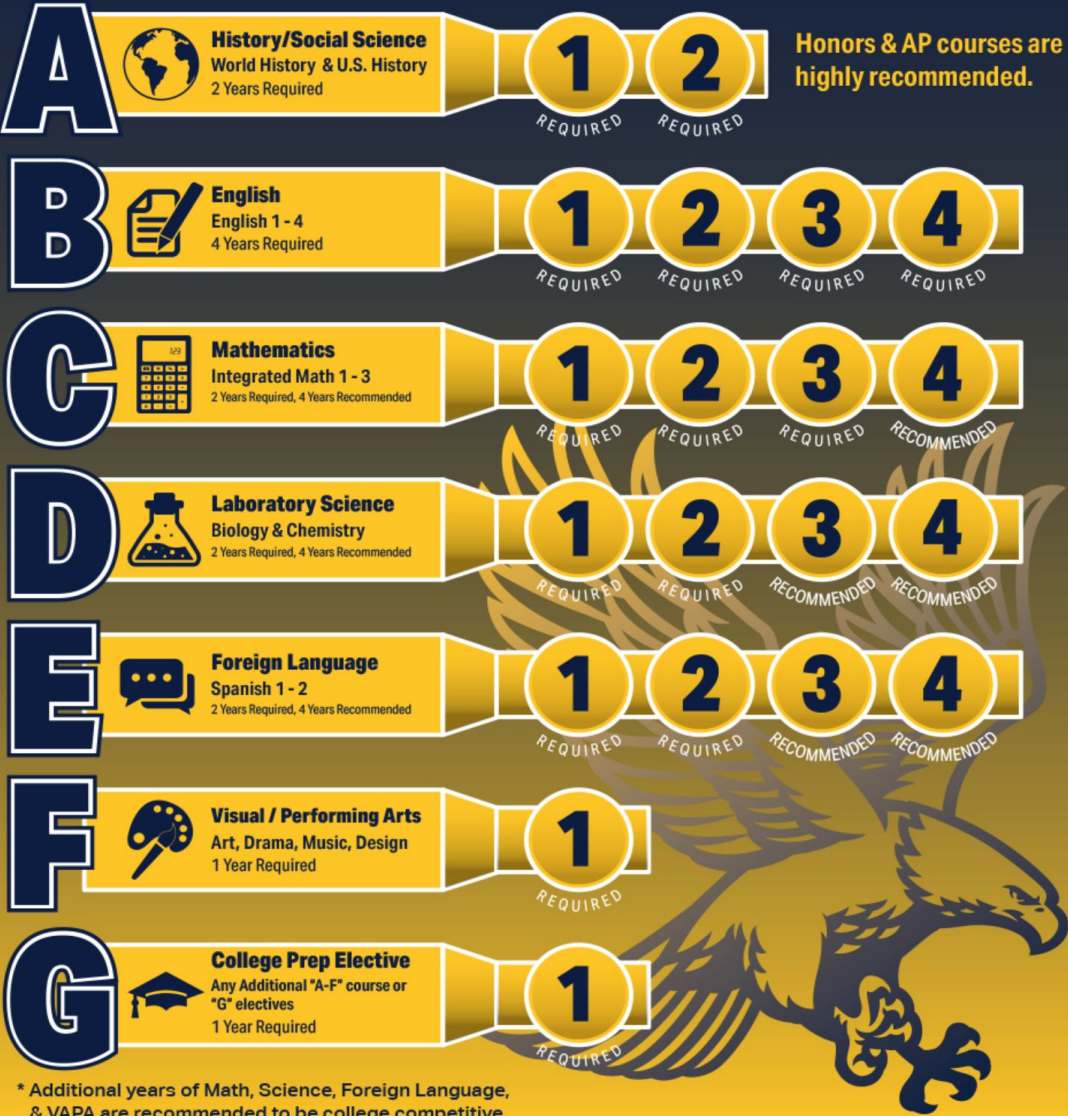
**All students must complete, at a minimum, two semesters of physical science and two semesters of life science.

***All students must complete Integrated Math 1 (may be satisfied in 7th or 8th grade).



A - G REQUIREMENTS

The University of California (UC) & California State University (CSU) systems require that students complete at least 15 courses in the areas listed below to be considered for admissions. Courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Additional coursework beyond the minimum is strongly recommended.



* Additional years of Math, Science, Foreign Language, & VAPA are recommended to be college competitive.
