Parents or guardians, or both, of pupils of limited English proficiency who are not employed by the district shall constitute a majority of the DELAC. (<i>EC</i> sections 52176[a], 62002.5; 5 CCR Section 11308) [I-EL 2.0]
	2. The DELAC shall advise the school district governing board on all of the following tasks:
