#### SCOPE REVISED 3/17/2021

This budget is based on \$17,800,000 for modernization scope. Bear in mind these are ROM costs, so there is a strong possibility some numbers will be lower allowing more scope to be done. The list on the left has been revised after the Must Do's were updated as follows:

- · Admin Reception modernization added
- Building K Outdoor Learning Reduced from 14.344 s.f. to 5000 s.f.
- Decreased \$/s.f. numbers for CTE programs (Manufacturing, Carpentry, Healthcare Medical and CTE Leadership Lab) which were calculated at \$350/s.f. to \$250/s.f. The \$350 was factoring in including equipment.

At a 3/11/21 meeting with Hilary Wolfe, Director of Curriculum at and Instruction at EMUHSD that equipment costs can be covered by Strong Workforce Development Grants the district has won. The exact amount needs to be confirmed in the next phase of Schematic Design. The summary of that meeting is in the . CTE Lab Focus Group Report submitted 3/18/21.

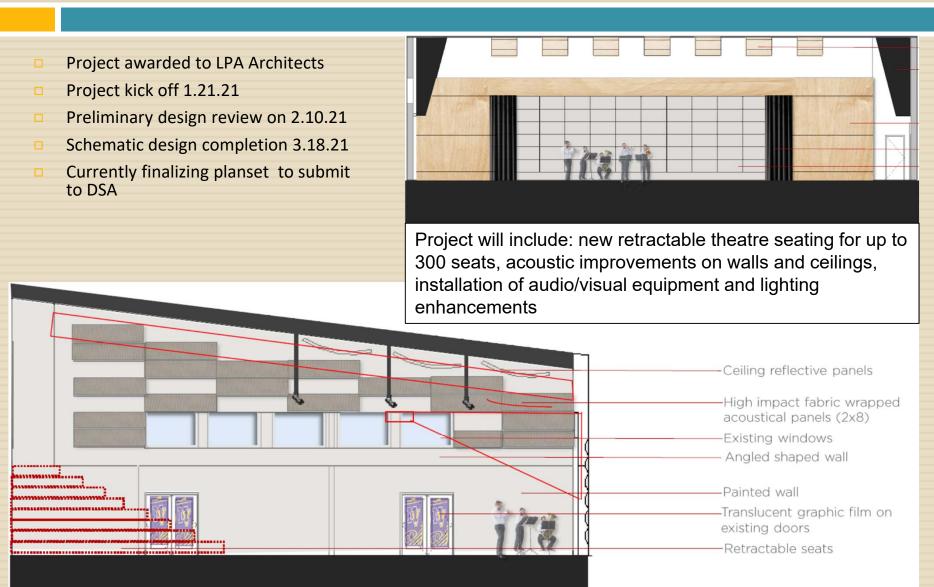

#### What is Next with Measure HS?

  - Provide advanced funding to cover delayed State matching funds that will be received at later dates
  - Provide construction funding needed to complete the artificial Track & Field projects in El
     Monte High and SEMHS
  - Provide recommendation to the Board to add additional group of projects to provide funding for the planning & design phases and take advantage of State matching fund availability]. Highly likely, modernization projects at AHS, El Monte High and RHS.
  - Fund construction escalation costs for all bond funded projects
  - Obtain & procure a program & project management software to help managing the program in-house and save on program management consulting fees.

- Staff will present staff recommendations for Board Approval in October



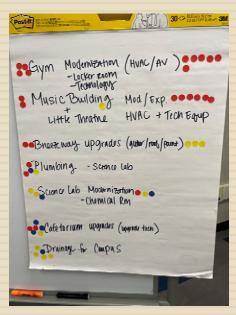


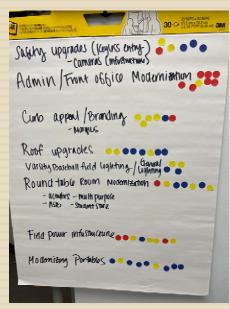

## Bond Sale – July 28, 2021

Summary of the District's 2021 bond sale, which included sales from Measure D (2008 Authorization), Measure HS (2018 Authorization), and refunding bonds, which refunded bonds related to Measure Y (2002 Authorization).

On July 28<sup>th</sup>, 2021, the District offered for sale its \$33.5 million 2008 Election Series E Bonds, \$53.3 million 2018 Election Series B Bonds, and \$14.4 million GO Refunding Bonds. The Bonds were sold at a time when interest rates were near all-time lows, translating into significant interest cost savings to taxpayers. The low rates also allowed the District to maximize the amount of project funds it could receive now and lower future tax rates for taxpayers through the refinancing of existing debt.

Prior to the sale date, and similar to what has been done before, the District solicited bond credit ratings from Moody's Investors Service and Fitch Ratings. Moody's affirmed the District's strong Aa3 rating, while Fitch gave the District's Bonds its highest rating of AAA. Both firms said the District's strong finances and tax base led to the ratings. Fitch's analysis gives a boost to bonds that are secured by an unlimited ad valorem tax as is the case with this Bond sale, resulting in the AAA rating.

The Bonds closed on August 18<sup>th</sup>, 2021, which was when the District received its project funds. Specific to the Refunding, District taxpayers will see savings on their tax bills beginning next year. Average annual savings are approximately \$109,600, or a total of \$988,350 over the next 10 years. The District was able to refinance \$11.96 million of prior Measure Y Bonds.
