Dr. Bristol presented RHS's Title I 2018-2019 Budget; discussion.

Dr. Bristol shared RHS New SPSA Template 2019; completing this document with specific goals is the current objective of the SSC, by December 2019.

Dr. Bristol referred the SSC to the cde.ca.gov where School Dashboard Reports and Data are reported for schools and districts in California.

The SSC reviewed the results for Rosemead's students who are Asian, Latino/Hispanic, English Language Learners, Socio-Economically Disadvantaged Ged Students with Special Education, and as an entire student body in the following areas:

Suspension Rates: Rates are declining for all subgroups; Asian students have the lowest rates (few suspensions); English Learners and Hispanic students have the highest number of suspensions.

Graduation Rates: Two years ago, 43% of all students graduated with A-G; at the same time 72% of Asian students graduated with A-G and 34% of Latino students graduated A-G.

CAASP English scores: RHS's Asian students scored the highest, Hispanic and English Learner students scored the lowest.

CAASP Math scores: Scores of RHS's Asian students increased and were RHS's highest in this area; Socioeconomically disadvantaged and Hispanic students score the least.

Mr. Quick suggested that Math scores are something we are all responsible for, that we all have a role in improving. We can reflect on our roles in helping to foster better mathematical thinking, and do things that will help. Perhaps invite a colleague from Math Department to discuss how to realize that objective.

Dr. Bristol will discuss this matter with Math Dept. Chair tomorrow and invite him to the meeting.
Parent Discussion RE: Their concerns with Math class instruction

Dr. Bristol's review of RHS Dashboard for current students, particularly those who are failing classes and those with high absentee rates

Discussion about how this information is used and shared, particularly with parents.

Dr. Bristol presented spreadsheet with ranks of CAASP scores for LA County/South California schools.

In last year's CAASP score ranking of all LA County Schools, Rosemead High School's overall ranking as a school was 17 in the area of ELA and 19 in the area of Math; RHS's socio-disadvantaged students ranked 9 in the area of ELA and 13 in the area of Math; RHS's Latino students ranked 23 in the area of ELA and 17 in the area of Math; RHS's Asian students ranked 30 in the area of ELA and 30 in the area of Math.

Dr. Bristol presented last year's budget. We want to spend this year's money by the end of December this year. Dr. Bristol talked about spending \$50,000 by December toward meeting the goal of closing the achievement gap.

This year we have \$594,000. Ms. Brown would like to propose that we identify the goals that we want to attack based on the data that we have seen at the next meeting Wednesday., Nov. 13th.

Goals:

1. That everyone who comes to Rosemead feels loved and supported
2. Each department align goals on actions they are taking to improve speaking and listening skills in all students.
