1:1 is a brand new initiative that EMUHSD has undertaken for the 2019-2020 school year. **Each student in the district has been given a chromebook** to use as a tool to help them complete classwork and be connected to the world via the internet. RHS is excited about this initiative and teachers are already re-designing aspects of their classes to utilize these excellent learning tools. Just like a textbook, students are expected to **bring their chromebooks to school every day** because they will likely have to use it in almost every class.

Many students took advantage of the **One Million Program** and received a free MiFi device which gives them internet access at home. Unfortunately, **this program is now closed** and others that want to enroll will have to wait until next school year.

Students were given cases and chargers for each machine and are expected to **keep the chromebook in the case** at all times for safety and security. They are also expected to charge the machine every night before coming to school the next day. **The charger for the machine can stay at home.**

Should anything happen to the chromebook, **we have repair services available and students will only be charged for repairs that are the result of their negligence.** Cracked screens are the most expensive at \$80.00, but if the student keeps the machine in the case and handles it appropriately, the screen should not be in danger. **If a student loses the chromebook the replacement fee is \$325.** Please stress to your child the importance of knowing where his or her chromebook is at all times, so it isn't left somewhere by accident. If the chromebook is stolen, **a police report must be filed** with your local law enforcement station or it will be considered lost and you will be charged the replacement fee.

Students should bring their machines to **room 43** if they need anything repaired. We will give them a loaner machine to use while theirs is getting repaired.
